By letter dated December 28, 2021, Governor Wolf indicated that, “[he] intends to provide [his] review of proposed maps in a public forum, so that members of the General Assembly, as well as the public, can understand [his] evaluation process.” Further, Governor Wolf has conveyed a, “Pennsylvania Redistricting Advisory Counsel made up of six members with expertise in redistricting, political science, and mapmaking,” to hold a series of eight in-person, publicly accessible sessions to ensure transparency in the creation of Pennsylvania’s New Congressional Map. Governor Wolf is expected to testify regarding the importance of the inclusion of citizen-voters from across the Commonwealth in the process of creating a Reapportioned Congressional Map for Pennsylvania. The Governor will be called, “as on cross-examination.”
