PETITION TO SET ASIDE NOMINATION PETITION

Fred Runge, Petitioner-Objector, by and through undersigned counsel,

respectfully avers that:

Jurisdiction

1. This Court has original jurisdiction in cases relating to election challenges

for candidate for State Representative. See 42 Pa. C.S. § 764(1); 25 P.S. § 2937.

Background

Fred Runge is a registered Republican residing in the 165th Legislative
 District at 242 Claremont Road, Springfield, Pennsylvania.

3. The 165th District is located entirely in Delaware County.

4. Robert Jordan is currently registered to vote in Swarthmore, which is located in the 165th Legislative District.

Although he had previously been registered to vote elsewhere in Delaware
 County (outside the current 165th District), Mr. Jordan was, prior to February 2022,
 a resident of Philadelphia County.

6. Mr. Jordan moved from Philadelphia County to Swarthmore, Delaware County, into a newly constructed house at 101 Oakdale Avenue.

7. The newly constructed home that Mr. Jordan was moving to was not completed and certified for occupancy until February 7, 2022. *See* Exhibit A.

8. Mr. Jordan did not move into the county, let alone the district, until after February 7, 2022.

Jordan Affidavit

 On or about March 28, 2022, Robert Jordan filed a nomination petition seeking the Republican nomination for State Representative from the 165th Legislative District. 10.In connection with the filing of the nomination petition, Candidate filed an Affidavit stating that he is eligible for the office of State Representative from the 165th Legislative District, but attempting to condition such statement. A copy of the affidavit is attached hereto as <u>Exhibit B</u>.

Constitutional Requirement of Residency

11. The Pennsylvania Constitution sets forth the requirements of qualifications of members of the General Assembly in Article II, Section 5. Members of the General Assembly are, *inter alia*, required to "have been citizens and inhabitants of the State four years, and inhabitants of their respective districts one year next before their election (unless absent on the public business of the United States or of this State) and shall reside in their respective districts during their terms of service." Pa. Const. Art II, § 5.

12. The Constitution does not condition the one-year requirement to exempt individuals who move within the Commonwealth. *See id.*

13.In fact, expressly the opposite is true, the one-year requirement specifically only applies to those who move within the Commonwealth as those who moved into the Commonwealth within a year would obviously run afoul of the four year requirement of Commonwealth residency. *See id.*

14. The case on which Mr. Jordan is apparently relying, based on the footnote to his affidavit, in fact rejected any attempt to suspend residency requirements arising out of an election. *See In re 1991 Pennsylvania Legislative Reapportionment Commission*, 530 Pa. 335, 352, 609 A.2d 132 (Pa.). As the Supreme Court said, its review of the decennial plan was "limited to those enumerated constitutional requirements in Section 16 of Article II of our Constitution. That Section does not include a requirement that all senatorial districts be redrawn in such a manner that incumbent senators remain residents of their redrawn districts." *Id.* at 352-354.

15. The Pennsylvania Supreme Court considered the issue and disavowed a candidate's property right in and to a district, instead looking to whether the District residents' right to have a representative, consistent with the requirements of the Constitution, and not about a candidate's right to run. *See id.* at 353-56. "There is no precedent in this state nor in the Federal Courts for a claim arising from the deprivation of an individual's right to run for a particular office nor of a citizens' right to vote for a specific individual." *Id.* at 356.

16. The footnote cited by Mr. Jordan is entirely inapposite. The footnote addressed a claim by a then-sitting Senator that by moving "his" district across the state and changing the number of the district in which he lived, if he was not seated as a Senator, the district's residents would be unrepresented for the last two years of a four-year term. *See id.* at 350, n.7.

17. While the Supreme Court in 1991 left unresolved a theoretical future claim by unrepresented citizens if the Senate refused to seat that Senator and refused to call a special election to replace him, the concern was about the people of a district being unrepresented, not the candidate's possessory right to an office. *See id.* at 350-56.

18.That situation is simply inapplicable to the situation faced in the 165th, where come December 1, 2022, every citizen of the district will be represented by whomever wins the General Election in November.

19.As the Supreme Court ruled in the last reapportionment, even interim concerns about redistricting and representation are simply inapplicable to State Representatives when new maps take effect at the beginning of a legislative term. *See e.g. Fagan v. Smith*, 41 A.2d 816 (Pa. 2012) (per curiam).

Statutorily Mandated Affidavit

20.Candidates for office in Pennsylvania are required to complete an "affidavit" that contains certain information, including residence, election district, the office sought, that the person is eligible for such office, and a number of other elements. 25 P.S. § 2870.

21. The statute expressly and explicitly requires an affidavit and expressly requires, *inter alia*, that the candidate swear or affirm that he or she is eligible for the office sought. *Id*.

22.Mr. Jordan executed an affidavit on March 25, 2022, however, in that affidavit, he altered it to condition his statement of eligibility. *See* Exhibit A.

23.Specifically, on that affidavit, Mr. Jordan placed an asterisk next to the word eligible and referenced an irrelevant case, *In re 1991 Pennsylvania Legislative Reapportionment Commission*, 530 Pa. 355, 609 A.2d 132 (Pa.).

24.Section 2870 does not allow for a candidate to condition his statement of eligibility. It must be absolute.

25.To the extent that Mr. Jordan is asserting a different interpretation of residency, he may have a defense to a future charge of perjury – if and only if his position is a truthfully held *bona fide* belief instead of an attempt to intentionally misconstrue an unrelated matter. However, the possible perjury defense is irrelevant to his eligibility for this office in this electoral cycle.

26.Mr. Jordan is, and on March 25 was, intimately aware of the fact that his relocation to Delaware County (and thus the 165th District) came after November 8, 2021, and that he was thus ineligible for the office he desired to seek. That is evidenced by the fact that he affixed what he apparently believed to be a conditioning footnote to the affidavit.

27.Would-be candidates who file false affidavits must be removed from the ballot. *See* 25 P.S. § 2937; *Cianfrani*, 359 A.2d at 384; *In re Nom. Pet. of Driscoll*, 847 A.2d 44 (Pa. 2004); *In re Nom. Certificate of Ramirez* (Pa. Cmwlth. No. 44 M.D. 2017, filed February 23, 2017) (as cited in *Pa Democratic Party v. Pa. Dept. of State*, 159 A.3d 72 (Pa. Commw. 2017).

WHEREFORE, Petitioners pray this Honorable Court to set aside the Nomination Petition and order that Robert Jordan not appear on the 2022 ballot for nomination in the 165th Legislative District.


