

However, our elected District Attorney has an ADA assigned to the MDJs to divert appropriate cases for special consideration and disposition at the MDJ level. For example, a truancy case may be continued and the juvenile referred to the YES program or WhyTry . Likewise, Veterans may be deferred to the Veteran Treatment Court at the Common Pleas level. The MDJs all cooperate and participate in the informal disposition of cases if the ADA deems cases appropriate.</p>



The President Judge of each Judicial District in Pennsylvania, including the undersigned, has been directed to submit a proposal to the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts concerning reestablishment, realignment, and/or elimination of Magisterial Judicial Districts within the Judicial District. The plan to be submitted will maintain the current districting. Prior to submission, comment is invited.

The undersigned is therefore inviting public comment on the following issues:

- 1) Shall all four (4) of Armstrong County's Magisterial Districts be reestablished "as is."
- 2) Shall any two (2) or more of Armstrong County's four (4) Magisterial Districts be realigned?
- 3) Shall the number of Magisterial Districts in Armstrong County be reduced from four(4) to three (3) through attrition, upon the death or retirement of any current Magisterial District Judge?

Comments on these issues must be in writing. The name and address of the commentor must be legible. The comment should also state the position of the commentor, such as township supervisor, chief of police, business owner, resident, etc.

The written comments will be forward to the AOPC together with the recommendations of the undersigned. 




