

(The following is an entirely new rule.)

**Rule 142. Waiver of Fees and Costs.**

A juvenile may seek or obtain a waiver of any fees or costs pursuant to Pa.R.J.A. 1990, except financial obligations imposed as a condition of an informal adjustment, a condition of a consent decree, or through a disposition of delinquency.

**Comment:** Pennsylvania Rule of Judicial Administration 1990 (Application to Waive Fees and Costs (*In Forma Pauperis*)) sets forth the procedure for seeking or obtaining a waiver of the payment of fees. The eligibility criteria at Pa.R.J.A. 1990(b) should inform the juvenile whether to proceed by application or *praecipe*.

For an expungement, an application for a waiver or a *praecipe* of counsel should be filed at the same docket containing the records the juvenile seeks to expunge or destroy.
