<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> The parties aver in their Application that the Exit Plan was introduced for Council's consideration on August 28, 2018. According to the parties: "The City of Harrisburg has been requested to appear at a Joint House Committee hearing on September 25, 2018, as proposed legislation is under review to permit the conditional retention of Act 47 tax rates for municipalities that have successfully departed both receivership and the distressed status designation." Application, ¶ 7. Further, the parties believe that conditional retention of Act 47 tax rates "may significantly alter the City's need for and duration of an Exit Plan for Harrisburg." Id. at 10. Finally, the parties aver that deferring Council's vote until November 15, 2018, will still afford the City enough time to complete the Exit Plan adoption process, allow the Court to consider the Exit Plan and Council to adopt a 2019 Annual Budget.
